**CASE MANAGEMENT ORDER
NO. 10 GOVERNING DISCOVERY
PROCESS RELATING TO
DEFENDANT PROFILE FORMS**

[ECF No. 743]

Before the Court is the Parties’ Joint Motion for Proposed Case Management Order No. 10 Governing Discovery Process Relating to Defendant Profile Forms (“Joint Motion”). ECF No. 743. Good case appearing, the Court **GRANTS** the Joint Motion.


Case Management Order No. 8 (ECF No. 573) sets forth the process for addressing discovery disputes relating to Plaintiff Profile Forms (“PPF”). This Order provides a similar process for addressing discovery disputes relating to Defendant Profile Forms (“DPF”). To the extent the discovery dispute process outlined in Case Management Orders Nos. 6 and 7 (ECF Nos. 442 and 466) provides anything to the contrary, this Order controls.

Plaintiffs shall have 30 days from service of a DPF to identify and provide notice of any deficiencies in the DPF to counsel of record for the Defendant. Defendant will have 21

1 days from Plaintiffs’ notice of deficiencies to supplement and/or amend the DPF or
2 otherwise cure the deficiency. If the deficiency is not resolved within 21 days, Plaintiffs
3 will promptly notify Defendants’ Co-Lead Counsel of the issue. If the deficiency is not
4 resolved within 7 days of notifying Defendants’ Co-Lead Counsel, the Parties will jointly
5 contact the Court to request a discovery conference, or, alternatively, if both Parties elect
6 to do so, the Parties may submit a joint status report regarding the pending discovery issues
7 prior to the next status conference with Magistrate Judge Torres.¹ The discovery issues will
8 be addressed at the subsequent status conference or a separate discovery conference, at the
9 Court’s discretion. **In no event shall the Parties delay longer than 60 days (from service
10 of a DPF) to raise discovery disputes relating to DPFs with the Court.**

11 **IT IS SO ORDERED.**
